I am of the opinion that to engage with people and try and bring change is the slowest form of the performing arts.

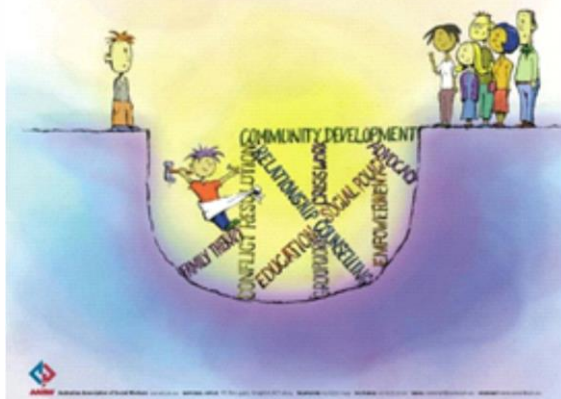
